SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

A completed submission package will contain the following documents:

1. Cover letter with contact information (address, phone, FAX, e-mail). Include names and contact information for 4 potential referees of your paper. Submit electronically as a PDF file.
2. Manuscript prepared using IEEE guidelines (double spaced, 1 side-per-page, separate page for each figure, abstract, references in IEEE format). See “IEEE Information for Authors” for style manual. When printed in the journal, the paper must not be longer than 2 journal pages. Submit manuscript electronically as both a PDF file and the original source (e.g., MS Word or Latex).
3. Example layout of article conforming to 2 journal pages using templates as guides. Submit electronically as a PDF file.
4. Electronically submitted figure files. The only acceptable formats are EPS, TIF and PS. According to the IEEE, color figures **MUST** be in TIFF format with recommended resolution of 400 dpi. Name your files “last_name_fig_x.eps (or .tif or .ps). Place each figure in a separate file. See “IEEE Electronic Text and Figure Guidelines” for information on preparing electronic versions of figures.
5. Signed copyright agreement.
6. Signed page charge questionnaire.
